Salvation in Three Tenses

English grammar is difficult to master. Yet, three tenses that denote time give us little problem. We all can understand the past, present and future tenses. When applied to salvation, they teach us wonderful lessons.

1. The Bible Speaks of Salvation In the Past Tense. This tells the Christian all of his past sins were forgiven. "For by grace you have been saved, through faith. . . . (Ephesians 2:8). We can look to one definite time in which all our past sins were forgiven and forgotten by God. This is the point at which we showed our faith in Christ as our Savior. We showed this when we were baptized in water for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 22:16; Galatians 3:26-27) At this point, God took all of our sins from us and will remember them against us no more (Hebrews 8:12). As a result of salvation in the past tense, we have a freedom from guilt. We may approach the throne of grace boldly since we are not charged with the sins of our past.

2. The Bible Speaks of Salvation In the Present Tense.

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). Salvation in the past does not free us from sin in the present (1 John 1:8-10). We still sin, and need the forgiveness of God This must come to the Christian on a continual basis (1 John 1:7). This salvation also requires our faithful obedience. "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another and the blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, purifies us from every sin" (1 John 1:7). Present forgiveness comes to us when we are willing to acknowledge we are sinners, and to walk in God's light. This is shown by necessary repentance and prayer (Acts 8:20-24). What is the results of a present salvation? It means we have assurance we have been forgiven. We can know we are right with God.

3. The Bible Speaks of Salvation In The Future Tense. "...

. We shall be saved through His life". (Romans 5:10). The ultimate salvation will come at the day of judgment when we hear, "well done. . ." This salvation is our eternal goal. It is ours, if we continue to believe (Hebrews 3:12) What does this future salvation mean to us? It fills us with hope (Titus 1:3). It gives this life real meaning and fills us with anticipation. We are made thankful by the past. We are filled with assurance in the present. We are given a hope for the future. I hope these three truths about salvation will help you understand more fully the importance of our study together at the worship hour today.
