

Relping The Lord's Work In India

What does your money help to accomplish in India? It is good question, & one that deserves a good answer. Before we deal with that, please know that we seek—always—to be good stewards of the funds entrusted to us.

Recently we have dealt with a number of projects that have been on the "back burner" for some time, & with most of them, the "expiration date" had arrived. As much as we would like to spend all our funds on teaching others the Word of God & benevolent work, the truth is there are other things we have to deal with.

In strategic areas, church buildings become more than just a place for the church to meet for worship. They are centers of evangelism, places for KCMBI (Kate Cabe Memorial Bible Institute) schools (1-day per week preacher-training schools), places to meet with preachers, etc. Without church buildings, communities tend to look at our congregations as temporary & unsteady groups of people. So, in view of these things, we help some congregations financially with their meeting places.



An example of this has been the church building for the Lord's church in Balanagar in Hyderabad. Bro. B. Chinna Raju is the preacher for that congregation. A very bad storm during the monsoon season finished off the building that was old & of very poor construction. It simply collapsed. Bro. Jerris Bullard shared this expense & a new church building was constructed—much larger than the original. This is a great blessing for the Lord's work in this area of Hyderabad.

We were blessed with a large gift in January & another one in February both of which were to be used only for evangelism. We have been faithful in doing just that. As this is being written, so far this year our team has conducted 85,137 1-day Gospel meetings that have been instrumental in leading a total of 167,573 souls to obey the Lord. Our team has planted 2,357 new congregations & among those baptized, 866 were denominational preachers.

The only way we will be able to sustain such an evangelistic thrust is to have massive donations specifically given for preaching the Gospel. Our Indian brethren need funds for travel, food & a place to stay at night when away from their homes. As in all of our work, funds designated for any particular aspect are used only for that purpose.

In the past several weeks, we have had to help 3 of our very best workers in India. Two of them required heart surgery & the 3rd had a stroke. Medical bills for these 3 brethren totaled \$15,800. All 3 of these brethren are doing well now, but this has been a major expense we had not counted on.

While medical expenses in India are still just a fraction of what those same procedures would cost in the USA, they have increased greatly in the past few years. Brethren here in the USA may ask why they do not have health insurance—the answer is very simple: they simply cannot begin to afford it. One of these brothers is not supported by us & is really much more financially vulnerable.

When you have good workers, it makes sense to take good care of them. These 3 brethren are some of the very best we have, & we need to keep them around for a long time to come, the Lord willing. Thus the reason for paying their medical bills.

As we have funds available, we assist Christian widows whose husbands worked with us. Many of these men never received any financial help from us while they were living—we simply cannot give monetary assistance to all the local preachers who work with us. If these women cannot pay off debts left by their husbands (which usually were to build a hut &/or a church building), then they lose them to their money lenders.

The average cost per widow—for all those we have assisted—is now about \$2,000. Because we have received some large gifts specifically to aid such women, we have been able to help more than 250 of these women in the past 3 years. At this time, we have spent all we have received for this purpose. We just helped 2 more in the Markapur area that cost \$5,100. Their houses have been saved from being seized by money lenders & they are now out of debt.

We try to give the more active Indian workers on our team a 1-time "big help". Recently, 10 Hyderabad preachers received about \$550 each to finish paying for flats in a poor area of Hyderabad. A government program provided them with a good portion of the amount they needed, but each man had to give Rs. 37,000 to finish the payment. They now have their own houses—their 1-time big gift from us.

In addition to Bro. Chinna Raju's meeting place for the Balanagar church in Hyderabad, we have aided 8 more congregations financially with their church buildings in the past 2 months. Sometimes a denominational group (for whatever reason) puts its building up for sale. We can often buy such a place for about half what it is worth.

And another thing about buildings. We had to make repairs on our preacher-training facility in Markapur, & for our main building at Bidar. The latter is where Indian brethren & our drivers stay while we are on campaign trips there.

We had a dormitory in Bidar for our school there, but we lost our very capable director a few years ago. Bro. P.

Moses John died tragically as a result of a heart attack—his death dealt a severe blow to our team's efforts.

No one else was really suited for the job—& so we made a change. We closed that school & the dorm was remodeled for living quarters for our American workers. Consequently, we can stay in Bidar to work for longer periods of time.

Bidar is a "launching pad" for the Lord's work in several directions. Not only do we have a thriving work in the city, we have opportunities in smaller towns in the area & even in the 2 bordering states. Having a "home" while on the road & not having to stay in a hotel—& not having to move from place to place is a real blessing.

We paid property taxes on some of our buildings where we operate preacher-training schools, children's homes, etc. We gave assistance to a brother who owns a car in need of repair. He uses it as a taxi during the day, & then uses it to go to Gospel meetings at night, often taking other preachers with him for other meetings.

And we gave 10 KCMBI teachers 1-time gifts. These men serve without pay from us in doing this very important work of helping to train preachers. We have a 3-year goal to give all KCMBI teachers such gifts (Rs. 5,000—about \$75). We are also giving their wives a sari.

These 1-day per week schools (Kate Cabe Memorial Bible Institute) are found in more than 1,600 locations. Many of our Indian brethren believe this school is the best thing we are doing in India, because it affects the Lord's work in such a positive way on several fronts.

In addition to all these projects, we have been involved in taking the Gospel to huge numbers of Indians who are interested in learning about Jesus & His Word & His church.

When you make a donation to this work, you can be assured that we are doing all we can to spend money in a way that will (1) do the most good; (2) help the most people; (3) be used as you ask it be used; &, (4) be in the best stewardship possible. Last year, the average cost per convert was \$3!

IMPORTANT NOTE: Regardless of the success of this work, we are faced with many problems, obstacles & frustrations. Some of these are truly monumental—all because Satan will not stand by idly & allow this kind of success of the Gospel in India to go unchallenged.

We are facing some truly difficult times at this time, & we need wisdom & God's help to deal with these & overcome them. The need for additional financial help is one of those, but certainly not the only one. Please remember all of us on this team in your daily prayers.













