Introduction

- 1. Let's review part 2
 - a. Jude draws upon their store of knowledge to list four reasons for battling the enemy false teachers
 - 1. First, because their destruction is certain (vs.5-7)
 - 2. Second, because their tongues are blasphemous (vs.8-10)
 - A . What are some characteristics of false teachers?
 - 1. Irreverent cynicism toward things that are spiritual and religious (v.9).
 - 2. Irreverent reviling of matters they don't understand (v.10).
 - 3. Irreverent pursuit of animalistic desires (v.10).

 - A. Four Reasons for Battling the Enemy
 - 3. Because their relationship with Christ is empty (vs.11-13) Deliberate Hypocrisy!
 - a. "Woe to them" (v.11) Jude cited three examples from the Old Testament illustrate the enormity of their sins Three men who rebelled against God's authority and who suffered for it.
