Will Your Children Go To Heaven?

Elders across the nation are concerned about young people's drop-out rate. As well they should be. It is tragic to see precious boys and girls, who are thrilled with Bible Study when young, grow cold and uninterested in the Lord's work as they grow older.

Congregations made in-depth studies to find the problem. What is needed? More youth programs? More rallies? Special teachers? One cause began to emerge. Their faithfulness had little to do with special programs or teachers. It did not matter if they are members of large or small churches. The single most important factor was their own immediate family.

One church found that where both parents were faithful, which included interest in all programs, 93% of the children remained faithful. On the other hand, if only one parent was faithful, the figure dropped to 73%. Where both parents were only marginally active, it fell to 53%. The shocker – in cases where both parents attended infrequently, 6% of their children stayed faithful. **SIX PERCENT!**
