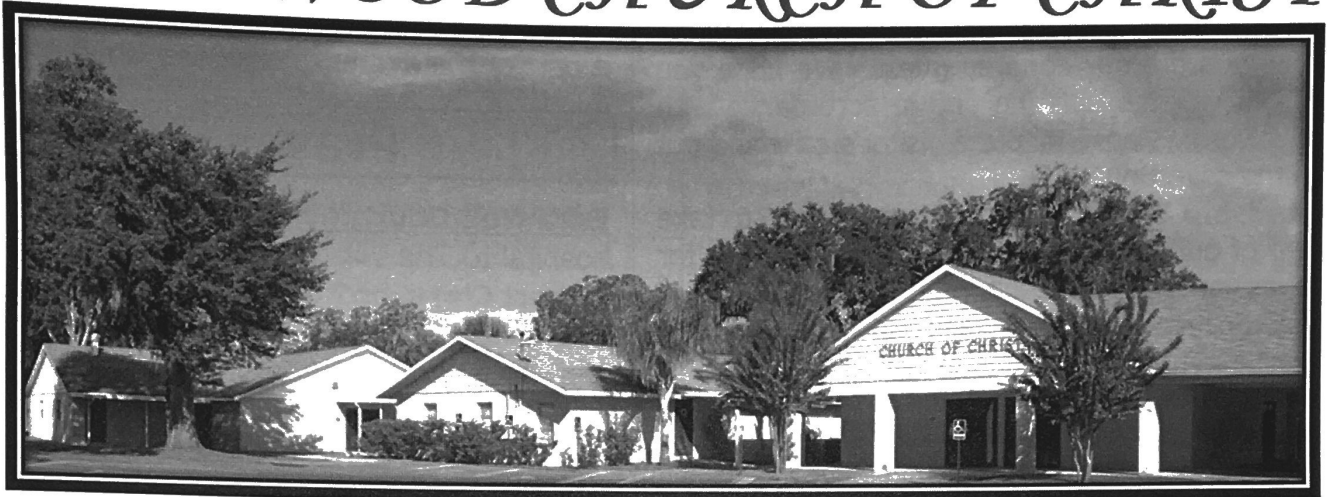

A Thankful Thanksgiving

I like Thanksgiving. It's the only national holiday we have, I believe, which wasn't set to celebrate a national victory at war or the birthday of some national hero or some such matter. To the best of my knowledge it's a holiday observed only in the United States and Canada. Most of us can genuinely say, "I am thankful for what I have." When we tend to get a bit discouraged and negative in our thinking, we need to look around us and see the situation in which others find themselves. Without exception, there are always others whose condition is far worse. It was the wise man Solomon who said, "In the day of prosperity be joyful, and in the day of adversity consider: God has made the one as well as the other..." (Ecc.7:14).

A little boy defined salt this way, "Salt is what always spoils the potatoes when it is left out." Using the same negative approach we can say, "Ingratitude is what always spoils life when it is left out." A thankful spirit enables one to praise God when circumstances are difficult. Alexander Whyte, a Scottish preacher, always began his prayers with an expression of gratitude. One cold miserable day his people wondered what he would say. He prayed, "We thank thee, O Lord, that it is not always like this."


Once a wealthy woman told her doctor that she was frustrated by restless desire for more and more things. He replied, "These are the usual symptoms of too much ease in the home and too little gratitude in the heart."

It was a wise man who prayed over a heavy Thanksgiving table: "God, please grant us one more blessing... a thankful heart." Words of wisdom are found in

Deut. 8:10-11. "When thou... are full... beware that thou forget not the Lord."

I hope this Thanksgiving season will be an especially blessed one for all of us and that we will remember His bountiful blessings in prayer, in our daily living, and in giving back to the Lord as He has blessed us.
