Second, it is a peace that belongs unto Jesus. There was no one else who could offer this peace. Even the great Roman armies who presided over the *Pax Romana* could only provide for the here and now. Jesus however, could offer peace for an eternity. Paul said it well in 1Corinthians 15:19: "*If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.*" Our hope looks toward the life to come, and, because we are focused on the eternal heavenly home, we have peace in this life. Ours is a peace not dependent upon political resolutions and military victory. Rather, the Christian looks beyond. And that brings us to our next point.

This peace is different from what the world offers. I walked through a major bookstore the other day. The self-help section seems to grow daily. There are books there that teach us how to control our debt and control our weight. Other volumes explain the ins and outs of astrology and tarot cards. Another section teaches us that peace comes when we love ourselves and are content with who we are. Yet another book tells us that men and women are from different planets. Among all these books, not one can offer everlasting peace. In fact, this old world got along just fine for millennia without their advice. But in all ages, God has offered His peace to His people.

Paul would tell us that peace does not come from getting, but from contentment: "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content" (1Timothy 6:6-8). That's good advice, a lot less expensive than a \$29.95 book.

It is a peace that must be shared. I said at the beginning that true peace comes at a price. It is not lavished upon us. While we can never earn the peace of salvation, it does come with responsibilities. Namely, there is the responsibility to share our peace. Jesus told us to spread the message of peace throughout the world (Matthew 28:18-19; Mark 15:15-16). Wouldn't you agree that Jesus expects more than a Hallmark sent during Christmas? "*Peace, good will toward men*..." (Luke 2:14). Isn't that a message that demands to be shared every day?
