God's Amazing Grace

Two books that I have enjoyed reading in the past are "What's So Amazing About Grace?" by Philip Yancey and Scott Peck's book, "The Road Less Traveled". Both books stayed on the New York Times best seller's list for a long time. In Philip Yancey's book, he tells about a friend of his riding a bus to work, overhearing a conversation. A woman was reading Scott Peck's book, and a man across the aisle asked the woman, "What are you reading?" "A book a friend gave me" she said. "It changed her life." "What's it about," he asked. "I'm not sure, some sort of guide to life. I haven't gotten far. Here are some of the chapter titles - discipline, love, grace." The man stopped her. "What's grace?" he asked. "I don't know. I haven't gotten to grace yet."

Is it really possible that people in the world have no concept of what GRACE means? Does that last line, "I don't know, I haven't gotten to grace yet," describe you today?

What is so amazing about grace? To help us all answer that question, we will study in our lesson during the worship hour, the four parables in Luke 15. But for now consider another parable Jesus told in Luke 18:9-14. In this parable, you have a Pharisee and a tax-collector who went up to the temple to pray. Note the contrast of these two men: a Pharisee (self-righteous), and a publican (humble). Two prayers: one prayed to himself, the other prayed to the God of grace. Two results of their prayers: one went home justified, the other did not.

As Christians living in a sinful world filled with many temptations, we should, everyday respond to **God's Amazing Grace** in prayer with the right attitude (humble). The Point - acknowledging that we are sinners in desperate need of the grace of God, will remind us to appropriate the right kind of faith in action that will give God all the glory He deserves.

It will do us all well to remember the lines from a song we sing together, "Thru many dangers, toils and snares I have already come. Tis grace hath bro't me safe thus far and grace will lead me home . . ." ~David
