Joshua: A Man Of God Speaks

The Bible is filled with illustrations of men who failed God miserably – Solomon, for instance, and David, his father. Even God's great servant Moses made a serious mistake during his final days on earth. Consequently, God did not allow him to lead the children of Israel into the Promised Land. (Numbers 20:7-13; Deuteronomy 32:31)

In our lesson today, we will see that Joshua stands out on the pages of the Old Testament as one of those rare biblical characters who exemplified walking in God's will throughout his entire lifetime. True, he was just as human as his fellow Israelites – and as we are – and at times he made some serious mistakes. But Joshua's mistakes were never as serious as those made by the men who succeeded him.

In Joshua 23 and 24, we will see that "Joshua was old, advanced in years" as he gathered Israel's leaders together to share with them the burden that lay on his heart. (Joshua 23:1) He had completed his earthly task. He had led Israel into the Promised Land. In seven exciting years, they had defeated the Canaanites sufficiently to eliminate any future military threat and resistance Joshua had just completed dividing the land among the tribes as God instructed. Now he had some final words about Israel's recent experiences in Canaan. Why not take a moment and read Joshua 23:3-11 before worship and be prepared to study this text before the sermon today. Following Joshua's clear-cut and vivid reminders that it was no one else but the Lord God of Israel who had given them the land of Canaan, he made this final point with equal clarity: Some Things Gotta Go! (read Joshua 23:12-16). In conclusion, Joshua's fresh historical perspective reminded Israel that it was the Lord their God who brought them into the land and gave them victory after victory. Joshua is a great example for every Christian today, to realize that God uses our talents and skills for helping the church go forward. Like Joshua, a Christian who puts God first in his/her life will always reflect with honesty and true humility that it is God who is responsible for all we are and have. Paul wrote about this in Ephesians 3:20-21 - one more set of scriptures to read before the lesson.
