To protect each other, we are asking <u>EVERYONE</u> to follow some very important guidelines:

- * Anyone who is considered high risk, please do not feel pressured to assemble. The governor's state guidelines still recommend this group of people to <u>stay home</u>. This includes those who are 65 and over; those who have diabetes, heart or lung disease and those with weakened or compromised immune systems of any kind, and also those who are caring for people with these conditions.
- * If you are ill or have recently been exposed to someone who is ill, PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND.
- * We ask everyone attending to **please wear a face mask**. You can take it off once you are seated in the auditorium but put it back on when service is over.
- * Bring your own hand sanitizer and use it before you enter the building. We have some sanitizer, but we may not have enough for all.
- * Everyone must stay 6 feet apart (unless you live in the same household).
- * <u>PLEASE</u>, **Do not** give hugs or handshakes. Wave to each other from at least 6 feet away.
- * Please do not let your children move around the building, either before or after service.

Procedures for Worship:

 \sim When you arrive, someone will be at the door with individual communion items. At the end of service, there will be trays where you may place your contribution as you leave the auditorium.

~Those living in the same house please sit together, otherwise we must sit at least 6 feet apart.

~The pews are taped off, every other row and need to stay empty to keep the 6-foot separation.

~Please do not use the Bibles or the songbooks that are in the pews.

~At the end of service, we will dismiss one row at a time, starting at the back of the auditorium. As tempting as it will be, after service, please <u>do</u> <u>not</u> linger together in the foyer. As soon as we are dismissed, please **exit** the building and you can visit outside, but **still keep the 6-foot separation**.

Thank you so much for your cooperation in following these guidelines. They are important to maintain the health of our congregation and community.
