 - c. They will work in every local church body around the world as well.
- 2. They are essential concepts (proven) in building up the local body of Christ **Acts 2:45-47**

I. Walking With One Another In Fellowship

- A. "Joined and knit together" Ephesians 4:16
 - 1. anchor verse **Ephesian 4:16** Paul describes very specifically **how God intended for the local church to grow and mature in Christ**.
 - a. When it comes to leadership, what do we see in vs.11?
 - b. Why leaders? see vs.12
 - c. Did God intend for church leaders to do God's work (ministry) all by themselves?
 - d. Answer: see vs.13-16
 - 2. How does a local church of Christ actually grow and mature in love?
 - a. answer see vs.16
 - b. Do we want the church to become what our Bride Groom wants? What does He want?
 - c. see Ephesians 5:27; Revelation 19:6-8

B. "Speaking The Truth In Love" – Ephesians 4:15

- 1. When we, in the body of Christ, seek to build up one another, it must be rooted and grounded in God's revealed truth.
- 2. We saw this model followed in the early church in Jerusalem (lesson 6).
 - a. Acts 2:42
 - b. Only Christ and His word will build a strong foundation on which to stand. 1Corinthians 3:10-11
- 3. Closely aligned with their learning experience with the word of God was "fellowship" (koinonia).
 - a. vs.42
 - b. Divine directive True Christianity, by God's own design, "Is to be deeply relational".

- c. see 1John 1:3,7
- d. What will happen if a local body of Christ is not relational?
- e. Example of relational success Acts 2:44-47

C. Our Commitment To One Another - Romans 12:15-16

- 1. In the text, **Romans 12** used a number of metaphors to illustrate **how the local church should grow and function in this world.**
 - a. Architecture metaphor 1Corinthians 3:9; Ephesians 2:20-22
 - b. Agricultural metaphor 1Corinthians 3:9; Mark 4:1-20

D. We are "members of one another" Romans 12:4-5

- 1. In these verses, Paul used one of his favorite metaphors the human body.
 - a. Romans 12:4
 - b. 1Corinthians 12:14-16
 - c. How should the human body work? _____
 - d. Did the brethren in Corinth understand this metaphor by Paul?
 - e. Notice again, how Paul approached this analogy in **Romans 12:4-5** . . . now see **Ephesians 4:16**.
- 2. **The focus of Paul's teaching:** That every Christian **is** important in every local church wherever that church is located in the world.
 - a. Can the local church family function properly if only a few are doing ministry?
 - b. Every Christian has something to contribute! see vs.6-8
 - c. What will happen if a local church does not take this directive seriously?

E. "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love" – Romans 12:10

- 1. Here, Paul used another metaphor a family analogy.
 - a. Paul used the Greek word **philadelphia** (brotherly love).
 - b. "Brotherly" or "brothers" is a generic word that refers to a family.
 - c. Think back to our anchor verse in **Ephesians 4:16** and compare it to:
 - (1) Colossians 2:19
 - (2) **Romans 12:10**
